

Thank you very much for your responsive Email. We really appreciate on your decision, and accept your offer accordingly.

Actually, the reason I emailed you was also because I wanted to inform some revisions I should make as part of my responsibility (as author) for some errors I made prior to submitting the paper and some additional facts due to updated references (all of these revisions appear in blue-colored letters/ font):

1. Revision on Lipolytic bacterial isolation method section. In this part, actually we did 2 methods at once, and the results as presented by Figure 1 was actually came from method using Trybutyryn, not the one using Rhodamine B. We decided to omit results using Rhodamine B because its lipolytic zone was visually more difficult to observe. So, we replaced the Rhodamine method with the Trybutyryn one.
2. Addition on newly published articles (WHO, 2017) and (Ethica et al., 2018) as references, which contain reasons why we need to conduct this study (that we want to publish in your journal). As part of a larger project, I could guarantee that this going-to-be published article will merit a number of citations in the future.
3. Revision on Figure legends (Figure 3 and 4), which previously were not matched with the displayed colonies.
4. I added DOI information on each reference (if any).

The revised manuscript is attached.

I am looking forward to hearing further steps required to publish our articles in AJC.
